We are not sure how far back the search for historical evidence will go but two of our councillors say that it has not been used as anything other than a footpath in their lifetimes - so at least the past 70 years. Other reasons for opposition include: the fact that there is a stile part way along thus indicating that it hasn't been used for anything other than a footpath for many years; the path goes through a yard which the resident uses for stone breaking, the noise and activity could be very dangerous for riders (sudden and loud noises could cause horses to bolt) and others; the condition of the path would require considerable expenditure to upgrade it to a bridleway. , whose book 'South West Peak: history of the landscape' covers industrial history in I have also spoken to the area and as a volunteer ranger now leads history walks around Quarnford and knows this track very well. Although he says there is a possibility it might have been used for transporting coal in the distant past with packhorses or carts, it is very unlikely due to the inhospitable terrain and the fact that there were far easier ways of moving goods around and through the area. He has found no evidence of it being used in this way. The only possible use by anyone other than pedestrians might have been a cart or horses between the 2 farms along the way, one of which I believe has long been derelict. Unfortunately many local residents feel that horses, both individually owned and from the nearby trekking centre, have caused damage to several local tracks and are concerned that this path will also deteriorate, especially if mountain bikes etc also use it I imagine you will have spoken to the Peak Park as a consultee but if not, then I believe will be able to help. I hope this information helps, please let me know if the Parish Council can help further. I am writing to oppose this application by Louise Redfern on behalf of Staffordshire Moorlands Bridleways Group.

I have attached photographs, taken on 11/12/19 to explain my concerns, they show how saturated, with long areas of standing water this fragile path is.

Virtually the whole length of this proposed upgrade is peaty and boggy as it crosses Gradbach Moor. The heather that grows along the banks and edges and into the path itself has been in the slow process of re-generation over the last 5 years or so.

Gradbach Moor suffered badly from over- grazing in the past, but now with low stocking densities and thankfully the right balance of walkers, the Moor and the path are pristine and delightful. See photos.

As you descend from the Moor the path becomes very narrow, I'm not sure who would have right if way in this situation, but it would probably mean that either walkers or horses would have encroach beyond the path and trample on the verges.

Horses can be quite intimidating, and their heavy impact would not be suitable along this rare stretch of quiet, peaceful enjoyment.
