

Staffordshire to witness} We two of her Majestys Justices of the peace for the County of Stafford acting in and for the said County do hereby certify that we have this day viewed and surveyed a certain New Highway or Footway commencing at a point marked A on a Plan (shewing such New Highway or Footway and inclosed by the Clerk of the Peace for the County of Stafford amongst the Records of the said Court of Quarter Sessions) at or near Basford Bridge in the parish of Cheddleton in the said County of Stafford and extending in a northerly direction along a Highway leading from Basford to Cheddleton aforesaid to a point marked B on the said Plan and near to a gate leading to Basford Villa in the parish of Cheddleton aforesaid from thence through and across lands part of the said Basford Villa Estate in the said parish of Cheddleton aforesaid belonging to Mr. Edwin Heaton to a Highway leading from Leek to Basford in the parish of Cheddleton aforesaid and marked, with the letter D and near to a fence dividing the Closes of land called the Highfield and Barleyfield part of the said Basford Villa Estate and which was at the last General Quarter Sessions of the Peace for the said County ordered to be cut out and appropriated as a public highway or footway and that the said Highway or Footway so set out and appropriated as aforesaid is now completed and put into good condition and repair and likely to continue
